Due to the limited nature of the Minister's Discretionary Fund, the following applications hold a low priority for funding: * Educational/cultural exchanges overseas, where there is no demonstrable benefit for the wider New Zealand community or a significant sector of the community; * Sporting projects; * Arts projects. If your application falls into one of the above categories you can still ask for your application to be considered by the Minister. However, only a brief report is sent to the Minister.
